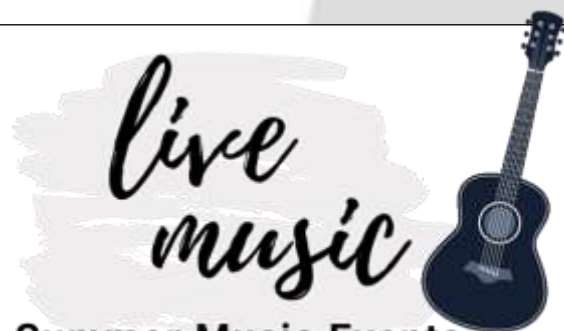

## Day Before the Awards Film Festival



On February 23rd the library, with support of the Friends of the Library, hosted the festival. A record-breaking attendance of over 400 people were treated to a showing of six of the great films nominated for Academy Awards. Film critics, *Jim Dickson* (left) and *Jackson Murphy* (right), provided commentary before each film and Q&A after. Along with films, there were games, prizes, and ballots to test film buffs' Oscar knowledge.

The 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Farmers' Market is coming up soon. The Friends have provided a grant to the library to keep vendor fees low and increase marketing to encourage more community members to support local businesses. We're also looking forward to guest vendors and new musical performers.



Grants from the Friends have helped the library renew subscriptions of resources that patrons regularly enjoy like BookPage magazine, The New York Times, The Troy Record, The Times Union, and The Wall Street Journal.

## New Museum Passes

Springfield Museums (the Amazing World of Dr. Seuss) is discontinuing their library pass program. With funding from the Friends, the library will add the *Eric Carle Museum of Picture Book Art* in Amherst, MA. Patrons have also requested the *Empire Pass*, which provides entry to parks, forests, beaches and trails operated by the award-winning state park system. 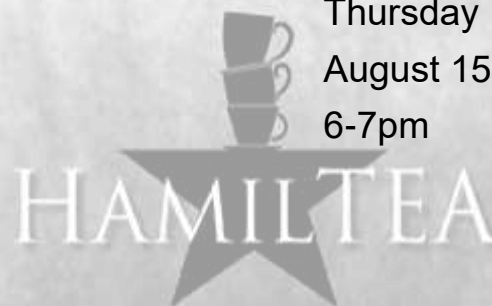
